In other news, I have been re-elected Mayor and Robert Black has been re-elected Deputy Mayor. Councils must elect a Mayor and Deputy Mayor from among their numbers every two years unless they have a popularly elected Mayor. This term of council will run until September next year when local government elections will be held across NSW.

It was an honour to officially receive my OAM on Tuesday 19 September. It was a very special occasion and I again thank everyone for their good wishes.

It is pleasing to see lots of projects underway across the local government area and it was great to hold our last Council meeting at the recently completed Coleambally Community Hall. Sitting on the rise that overlooks Brolga Place, it has pride of place in the centre of town. I note that the redevelopment of Brolga Place is progressing well.

I recently attended a 2 day Local Health Advisory Committee (LHAC) Forum in Deniliquin. With over 90 attendees from across the Murrumbidgee Local Health District (MLHD) it was a great opportunity to hear about the initiatives and many significant challenges of the health sector - the greatest of which is their workforce. As a member of the local LHAC, we find it difficult to attract people to be part of our Advisory Committees. Applications for LHAC's are currently open and I encourage you to put your hand up. Congratulations to Mayor and Deputy Mayor on Re-election

The Mayor and Deputy Mayor positions at Murrumbidgee Council will remain the same, with Cr Ruth McRae re-elected unopposed as Mayor and Cr Robert Black re-elected as Deputy Mayor, also unopposed.

Cr McRae said it had been a great honour to serve the Council and community since Murrumbidgee Council was formed in 2017.

"One of the highlights in my role as Mayor has been our success in securing government investment that has allowed us to proceed with a diverse range of major capital projects across the whole Murrumbidgee Council area".

"These projects have made an enormous impact on the daily lives of our community. They have been instrumental in driving growth in our area and building on the qualities of our area as an exceptional place to live, work and play," Cr McRae said.

Cr Black said the role of Deputy Mayor is a rewarding one that he has undertaken since Council's inception. He looks forward to continuing to build on the progress already made in achieving community goals and expectations.

Cr McRae and Cr Black will hold their position until the next ordinary election of Councillors, but not exceeding two years.

Jerilderie Water Supply & Restrictions

Jerilderie has permanent raw water restrictions as follows during Daylight Savings.

- Residential 6.00am to 11.00am and 6.00pm to 11.00pm daily (automated sprinklers or sprinklers on timers set to no more than 120 minutes or hand held)
- Commercial (including Council) 11.00pm to 6.00am (automated sprinklers), 6.00am to 11.00am daily (handheld or sprinklers on timers set to no more than 120 minutes).

Residents with automated sprinkler systems will be allowed to water outside the advertised times only with the permission of Council. Please contact Council by calling into the Jerilderie Office or telephoning 03 5886 1200.

10 Water Saving Tips

- 1. Before watering your garden, check the weather forecast!
- Only water your plants in the morning or evening and use a trigger nozzle!
- When brushing your teeth or washing your hands, turn off the tap and save 5 litres of water per minute!
- At laundry time, always use a full load in the washing machine!
- 5. When washing your car, use a bucket and a trigger nozzle on the grass, not the driveway!

- 6. At shower time, use a timer to keep showers to a minimum!
- 7. Think before you pull the plug! Could you rinse recyclables in that water or use the greywater safely on your garden?
- 8. When buying new products, look for the Smart Approved WaterMark or a WELS star rating!
- Look out for leaks! Check that your water meter stops overnight!
- 10. Fix dripping taps! A drip a second wastes 12,000 litres a year!

YOUR PET. YOUR RESPONSIBILITY. KEEP THEM SAFE!

For both dogs and cats:

- ✓ Microchipped by 12 weeks (or before if being sold/given away)
- ✓ Registered by six months of age
- ✓ Up to date registration details (in case your pet is lost)
- ✓ Not allowed to stray

Doggie do's:

- ✓ Under control at all times, whether on or off your property
- On a lead and under the control of a competent person when in public (except in a leash-free area)
- ✓ Not allowed to bark excessively

Some useful tips for cats:

- ✓ Identified with a collar, tag and cat bell
- Kept indoors at night to prevent hunting, cat calling and fighting
- Desexed to reduce straying, antisocial behaviour and unwanted kittens





With about 60 people in attendance, there was a spectacular performance by Dinawan Dancers including a Welcome and the ritual Smoking Ceremony.











Our Waste Journey

Continues

Residents and businesses have generally embraced the move to the new three bin waste collection service.

The three bins we now have are:

- Food Organics and Garden Organics (FOGO), with the bright green lid – goes to Wormtech Compost Facility to be remade into high-grade compost
- Recycling, with the yellow lid goes to Kurrajong Recycling
- 3. Garbage, with the red lid goes to landfill

The initial waste collection audit report shows everyone is making the effort to sort waste properly, but we still have some room for improvement with our initial contamination rates around 8-11.9%.

What goes in your FOGO bin?

- √ Food scraps
- ✓ Garden organics
- Compostable plastic kitchen caddy liners that comply with Australian Standard AS4736-2006 (for commercial composting) used to collect and transfer food waste to the FOGO bin

Make sure you remove the food waste from its packaging. Common contaminates in the green lid bin waste collections are soft plastics such as plastic bags and food packaging.









What goes in your recycling bin?

Here's what can go in your recycling bin (please rinse items first and put lids in separately):

- Aluminium trays, cans and foil (scrunched up to the size of an orange)
- ✓ Glass bottles and jars
- All paper, cardboard, newspaper, magazines and advertising brochures (not shredded) (no smaller than a business card)
- ✓ Rigid plastics in recycling triangle: 1, 2, 5 only
- Steel cans and containers, including aerosols
- 333
- NO items tied up in plastic bags.

The energetic spring growth means a weekly mow of the lawn! Remember to use your FOGO bin for all your garden waste, including grass clippings. No need to bag them - just tip them straight in the bin.



New telehealth service available after hours

Residents in Murrumbidgee Council area can now use a free Health Access Out of Hours GP telehealth service.

How does it work?

The service is able to treat presentations like abdominal pain, fainting, migraines, colds & flu, fever, sore throat, rashes, vomiting and diarrhoea, so you don't have to go to hospital.

You will be triaged and, if eligible, an on-call GP will return your call promptly and provide a consultation via video or telephone. If needed, an eScript will be generated electronically and sent to you. Your GP will be sent a summary of the presentation.
