BIG OPPORTUNITIES FOR SMALL BUSINESS

Small businesses in the Murrumbidgee Council area and beyond are set to be the big winners when construction of large-scale solar farms get underway.

The start of construction, expected in early 2018 in Coleambally, signals promising prospects for business in the region.

To help local tradies and suppliers find out what this work will mean for them, Council, in conjunction with Industry Capability Network and Office of Environment and Heritage, will host a networking session ***Big Opportunities for Small Business***.

Some of the opportunities include: Accommodation for workers, suppliers of demountables: offices/sleeping quarters/site toilets, food and beverage suppliers, hotel and sport club operators, transport providers, labour hire firms and heavy equipment operators/hirers. This is an opportunity for businesses to attend and find out how they can benefit from the jobs created during the construction of these large-scale photovoltaic (PV) solar farms.

MONASH DINNER: REMINDER

The tenth annual Monash Dinner will be held on Friday, 24 November.

Military historian Ashley Ekins will be the guest speaker and his talk is titled: General Sir John Monash, Master of the Battlefield—an Appreciation. Mr Ekins is head of the Military History Section at the Australian War Memorial where he has worked as a military historian for more than 27 years. A graduate of the University of Adelaide, he specialises in the history of the First World War and has published widely on the role of Australian soldiers in the Great War.

His publications on the First World War include: 1918 Year of Victory: The End of the Great War and the Shaping of History and War Wounds: Medicine and the Trauma of Conflict. His book, Gallipoli: A Ridge Too Far is a multinational study of the pivotal battles of August 1915.

Mr Ekins is also an authority on Australian involvement in the Vietnam War, having written extensively on Australian Army ground operations in Vietnam. To book contact Council (03) 5886 1200. Tickets are \$50 and includes a two course meal, the lecture, tea/coffee, slices, bar available.

SIR JOHN MONASH BURSARY

Applications are invited for the Sir John Monash Education Bursary.

Entry in this essay is open to long term residents of Murrumbidgee Council who are considering entering into post secondary education through University, College or TAFE, or an approved course of formal training with a Registered Training Organisation. The bursary is valued at \$2,000 and is awarded to assist with personal costs associated with course expenses.
