Whether you are looking to break a long journey; to relax and soak up some unique Australian history and experience country lifestyle; or to enjoy a great time at a local event –Jerilderie has plenty to offer in country charm and hospitality.

Jerilderie is known in history as the only place in New South Wales to be visited by the Ned Kelly Gang.

The township of Jerilderie, established in 1859, is nestled on the banks of Australia's longest creek, the Billabong Creek, and is located on the Newell Highway, which is the main inland route linking Melbourne and Brisbane and is on the shortest route from Adelaide to Sydney. Jerilderie (the English translation for the local Jeithi Aboriginal Tribe's word of 'djirridhuray'), meaning 'with reeds' or 'reedy place', is also the commencement of the Kidman Way, the now completed all weather road linking the southern states of Australia with the Northern Territory.

Jerilderie's calendar of events provides interesting opportunities to experience and celebrate country life. Whether it's a fun-filled day at the September Gold Cup Races, being dazzled by nature's brilliance at the Flower Show, or an evening of revelry at the longest running B & S Ball in the Riverina, the Jerilderie Round Up Ball, you can be assured there is many a memorable event in which to take part.

THINGS TO SEE AND DO



POWELL STREET HERITAGE PRECINCT

Jerilderie is steeped in history and surrounded by natural wonders, with plenty to see and do. Most attractions, modern public conveniences and shops are within strolling distance. For cars, caravans and motor homes, there is ample parking in Powell Street. A black water dump point is available adjacent Lake Jerilderie, the town's spectacular man-made lake.

Memorial Park and Garden

Memorial Park was completed in 2010 and is home to the Jerilderie Cenotaph. It is a peaceful site created to allow people to reflect and honour the fallen and those who served and continue to serve Australia in War. The park is also home to a Leopard tank, decommissioned and donated to the Jerilderie community and Jerilderie RSL Sub-Branch in 2010. A garden, established and maintained by the Jerilderie Public School and St Joseph's Primary School, can also be enjoyed at this site.

Luke Park

Visit Luke Park, with its fun children's playground, fully enclosed and shaded. Enjoy

a picnic or utilise the free barbecue facilities and undercover seating.

Steel Wings

Be awed by the massive Steel Wings Windmill. One of only two of its kind in the world, the 50ft tall, 25ft diameter mill construction is an impressive sight. Made in Sydney in 1909-10, Steel Wings was acquired from Goolgumbula Station before being relocated to Luke Park in 1979.

Horgan Walk/Lake Walk

A picturesque 20 minute walk allows you to enjoy nature as you wander, relaxing in tranquil surrounds, as the path meanders around the Billabong Creek, encompassing the Bush Tucker Trail. Growing along the Trail you will find various native species. There is even a genuine aboriginal humpy. The Walk commences and finishes at Luke Park. Lake Jerilderie is surrounded by an all-weather walking/cycling track.

The Willows Homestead

This stately old homestead, once housing the Jerilderie Museum and Jerilderie Historical Society memorabilia, began its life on this site as a Flour Mill, constructed for Thomas and

George Wise in 1884 and receiving its first ton of wheat for milling during the week ending 8 March 1885.

Post and Telegraph Office

During the Kelly Gang's raid in 1879, the telegraph line was cut to prevent any communication of the Gang's presence.

The Ned Kelly Blacksmith Shop

Step back in time and experience yesteryear, hear an eye-witness account of the raid on the Bank of New South Wales in Jerilderie by Ned Kelly and his gang, soak up the nostalgia of standing where the Kelly Gang's horses were shod in 'The Ned Kelly Blacksmith Shop'. A Collection of Australiana, fishing and blacksmithing memorabilia, souvenirs and bric-a-brac are available. Open by appointment: 0428 861 513.

Jerilderie Library

The Jerilderie Library is located at 41-43 Jerilderie Street and is a fantastic facility for all members of the community. The Library was previously located at the Old Court House until the new Library was built in its central location. Opened on 15 April 2009 it has a combination of historic and modern influences. The building is a replica to the

original "Banksi" home, which once stood at the site. The construction of the new library also included engaging a local artist, Helene Mortlock, to design two glass panels to display at the entry to the Library. The panels illustrate some of Jerilderie's rich history and present day influences, and include photographs as well as Helene's artistic drawing.

The Old Printery Building

The restoration of this building was completed in 2012. This building housed the printing shop and office of the Jerilderie and Urana Gazette run by Mr Samuel Gill. On Monday 10 February 1879 Ned Kelly tried to find Mr Gill in order to have him print his "Jerilderie Letter".

The Bolt Exhibition

"Doing the Bolt", an exhibition of convicts and bushrangers, is housed in the Old Printery building. This exhibition is an extensive collection of exact replicas and originals including: storyboards and banners detailing the life of bushrangers and convicts, pistols and guns, a flag flown at the Eureka Rebellion, a cat'o'nine tails and whipping post, shackles and locks and much more. Ned Kelly Raid Trail

Jerilderie is the only town in NSW featured in the Ned Kelly saga and has more surviving authentic Kelly sites than anywhere else along the Ned Kelly Touring Route.

Jerilderie's Ned Kelly Raid Trail is a self-guided tour of the 16 sites visited by Ned Kelly and his gang in 1879. With 6 of the buildings directly associated to the 1879 visit still standing, it's a fantastic insight into how the town looked when Ned visited. The trail is an enjoyable and educational way to explore Australia's bushranger history. A comprehensive self guided tour brochure, complete with time line, has been developed for the Kelly aficionados to directly retrace the footsteps of Ned and his gang as they proceeded to carry out an event that was to become an icon in the annals of Australian history. This guide is available from the Shire Office and several local businesses.

Follow in Ned's footsteps, explore the sites and make your own decision: Ned Kelly, hero or outlaw?

Railway Station

Development of the region was greatly assisted by the expansion of the railway network to link New South Wales and Victoria

in 1884. Jerilderie Railway Station was built by Charles Hardy in time for the opening of the line and the first train from Narrandera to Jerilderie in September 1884. The railway station is an example of British-inspired architecture from the Victorian era. The station closed its operations in 1987. State Rail funded restoration works in 2001.

Jerilderie Steam Rail and Heritage Club

On the second Sunday of the month (weather permitting), you will find the Jerilderie Steam Rail and Heritage Club operating over the bridge from Powell Street. The mini steam rail track is nestled amongst the Billabong Creek and provides an ideal location for the "older kids" to tinker with their toys and offers an exciting experience for the children and the young at heart. Jerilderie Historic Residence – Historic Home and Gardens

This grand old building has been restored to its former 1800s glory with pieces from the Queen Victoria era and a beautiful garden. Tours are available by appointment, contact Roy or Beth on 0499 849 320 or 0457 618 284.



Jerilderie boasts excellent facilities for a relatively small community of 1496 people.

Facilities include: Ambulance Station, MPS with accident and emergency and acute care services, Medical Centre with GP, Pharmacist, Bank, Post Office, Civic Hall, newly constructed Library with internet access, Pre-School and two Primary Schools. The town has Anglican, Roman Catholic and Uniting Churches.

A range of affordable housing is available in the township. Wunnamurra Estate contains fully serviced residential allotments. Some blocks have frontage to Lake Jerilderie or the Billabong Creek. Stage 2 of the Wunnamurra Estate is currently under construction and will be marketed in 2014.

Jerilderie is also home to a fantastic sporting precinct. Our Sports Complex houses an indoor basketball/netball/badminton court, modern gymnasium, squash courts, a 25 metre swimming pool, wading pools and a water slide.

The Jerilderie Sports Club has synthetic tennis courts and bowling greens, 18 hole grass greens golf course, and the Clubhouse offers a bar and Chinese restaurant facilities. Jerilderie

also has a turf racecourse, football/cricket ground and netball courts, and offers ample parkland.




The spectacular, man-made Lake Jerilderie, located within the township, is a beautiful and safe waterskiing venue which is utilised for many months of the year, creating a fantastic recreational outlet for families.

A number of active community service organisations contribute significantly to the quality of life in Jerilderie. Fundraising activities undertaken by these organisations have resulted in improvements to sporting, aged, medical and general facilities.

GETTING TO JERILDERIE

Jerilderie is 328km from Melbourne or 660km from Sydney. Train travel will take you to either Albury or Wagga Wagga, with coach service being available from Wagga Wagga to Jerilderie on Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Sunday. An aerodrome is located approximately 1 kilometre south of the town centre. The strip has a bitumen surface 1,138 metres in length by 15 metres in width – with gravel sides.

MORE HISTORY

Jeithi Tribe

Jerilderie was home to the Jeithi Aboriginal Tribe. The Tribal area was approximately 13,000 square kilometres, which extended north of the Murray River from west of Tocomwal to near Howlong, and to Jerilderie, Lake Urana and Lockhart. The last Jeithi elder David Kennedy, passed away in 1930.

Ned Kelly Gang

Jerilderie is the only town in New South Wales to be visited by the Ned Kelly Gang. From February 8th to 10th 1879, Ned and Dan Kelly, Steve Hart and Joe Byrne staged a hold up in Jerilderie. The Gang locked the police in their own cells, stole £2140 from the bank and destroyed a number of mortgage documents. The wires to the telegraph office were cut and Ned handed over the written account of his life actions to Edward Living, the bank accountant. This document is known as the 'Jerilderie Letter'. It is thought that in addition to the cash, the gang targeted Jerilderie to have Ned's Letter printed on the town's printing press. The Gang escaped into the forest which existed south of Jerilderie. Today the original Jerilderie Letter is held at the State Library of Victoria.

Sir John Monash

Sir John Monash, honoured military commander, whose image appears on our \$100 note, attended Jerilderie Public School from 1874 to 1877. His name can be seen in the head office of the school as Dux

In later life he achieved Arts, Civic Engineering and Law Degrees at Melbourne University. During 1897-98 Sir John utilised both his engineering and legal skills to be an expert witness and adviser to pastoralists, farmers and townspeople, who brought an action against David and Samuel McCaughey when they dammed much of the water on the Billabong and Colombo Creeks.

In World War 1, Sir John Monash was a Lieutenant-General in command of the entire Australian Army Corps. Monash received a knighthood, which was presented to him by King George V at his battle headquarters in



Bertangles, France, on 12 August 1918. Sir John Monash held the first ANZAC day service in 1916.

Sir John was a leading and loved public figure after the war, becoming involved in many public and private organisations, such as the Boy Scouts, and in the commemoration of ANZAC Day.

Each year (in October/November) Council hosts the popular Sir John Monash Dinner and Lecture, where a high profile speaker talks of their experiences and relates it to the principles displayed and developed during the life of Sir John Monash. To highlight the wonderful deeds and accomplishments of this very famous and celebrated Australian soldier, Council also present a bursary of \$1000 on the night to a student who has provided the best essay on Monash, to help them in their future studies.

Jerilderie has both a park and a tree lined avenue named in honour of Sir John Monash. The home where Sir John Monash lived as a child still stands at 30 Jerilderie Street, Jerilderie.

It was claimed that as a lad, Sir John Monash met Ned Kelly and held his horse for him; a claim never denied nor confirmed by Sir John, but doubted by future biographers of his career.

INDUSTRY



Since the introduction of the Merino west of the Blue Mountains, the Riverina plains have been recognised as the best Merino wool growing and sheep breeding area in the world.

In the 1900's a number of major Merino Studs were established in the Jerilderie area and supplied rams to sheep breeding areas throughout Australia, as well as being exported overseas.

The sheep were noted for their heavy fleeces of medium to strong wool and their ability to thrive in the harsher environments.

The "Poll" Shorthorn breed of cattle also originated in what is now known as "Silver Pines". D S McLarty, as manager of the adjoining "Bundure Station" bred 'an outstanding roan cow without horns'. He went on to found the world-first Lone Pine Poll Shorthorn Stud in 1884. Those genetics are still used today.

In 1926 the Yanko, Colombo and Billabong Creek systems were augmented from the Murrumbidgee River to create opportunities for expansion of agricultural industry in the area.

Irrigation construction commenced in 1954 and was enhanced with the completion of the Berriquin Irrigation Scheme in 1958. Extension of the Coleambally Irrigation System in Jerilderie Shire saw the commencement of rice growing in 1964. With ample water supplies, large scale vegetable growing commenced the following year.

With the increase in rice growing, Emery Rice Shed was constructed at Gala Vale in 1965 and the Hogan Rice Shed at Wunnamurra in 1970. In the same year the Corugan Irrigation Scheme was extended into Jerilderie Shire.

The Jerilderie district, once only famous for its stud sheep and wool production, was now also the centre of extremely productive irrigation systems originating from both the Murray River south of the town, and the Murrumbidgee River north of the town.

The district production now includes diverse crops such as rice, wheat, canola, grapes, onions, tomatoes, olives, barley, corn, soy beans and cotton.

FOOD, WINE & NATURAL WONDERS



Jerilderie is central to the well known wine producing regions of Rutherglen and Griffith. Both regions have established themselves as consistent producers of exceptional wines, confirmed with a multitude of national and international industry awards over many years.

Organic One

The Bonic family's 141 ha property is nestled along the Billabong Creek at Jerilderie and is home to one of Australia's first organic vineyards, Organic One. The Bonic family pioneered organic wine-making in the Jerilderie district more than 40 years ago, and that heritage has been honoured and taken to new levels by sons John and Frank. Billabong Produce

Produce is sown, grown, harvested and processed on the company's own land. The processed produce includes a wide range of tomato purees and tomato sauces, as well as diced, chunky and crushed tomato products. The freshly processed tomato sauces also include a variety of sauces containing other freshly harvested vegetables and herbs, making them ideal for use as high quality 'homemade' pasta sauces. Olive Oil of Australia

Jerilderie has a factory which produces oil from locally grown olive trees. The results of this labour are available for purchase from East End Welding. Ph: 03 5886 1289.

Fresh fruits such as strawberries, stone fruits and citrus are readily available from growers in the Cobram district.

Natural Wonders

There are interesting, quiet escapes in many parts of the region, whether it is fishing in the Billabong Creek, a picnic by Lake Jerilderie, or a cruise down the Murray River, Australia's largest river system. The bird, animal and plant life can be appreciated along the numerous walking trails in the region.

An interesting feature of the region's irrigation system, 'The Drop' is located on the Barooga-Berrigan Rd at the intersection of Melrose Rd. This is part of a large water-flow control system which allows water to divert from Mulwala Canal into Berrigan Channel and is worth a look.

The Blowhole is a natural phenomenon in an outcrop of granite rocks. When the Murray River is low, the blowhole flows and bubbles. It seems to "come alive". Some people say the Aborigines believed a giant Murray cod lived at the bottom. The Blowhole is situated approximately 11km out of Tocumwal on Rocks Rd.

DAY TRIPS



Located in southern NSW, the Riverina is famous for its rich heritage, natural beauty, fresh local produce, award-winning wine, and a welcoming hospitality that will make you feel right at home. There is something unique to discover around every corner.

Local Markets

History and Culture

Make Jerilderie your base as you travel to explore the Ned Kelly history associated with places such as Beechworth and Chiltern.

For those interested in learning more of the Kelly Gang history, follow the Ned Kelly Touring Route from Jerilderie to Melbourne, exploring the legend of Ned Kelly through the many historical sites located throughout North Eastern Victoria. Travel via the gourmet region of Beechworth, Benalla, Mansfield and Euroa, finishing with Ned's armour at the Old Melbourne Gaol. The original Jerilderie Letter is housed at the State Library of Victoria.

There are a number of events which celebrate and embrace the history and culture of the region, including Deniliquin's Play on the Plains Festival, which includes the famous Ute Muster, Griffith's 'La Festa', a large multi cultural event showcasing the region's rich

cultural diversity, premium food and wine industry and a wealth of traditional arts and music, Lockhart's "Spirit of the Land" Festival, and Griffith's Festival of Gardens, including the famous citrus sculptures.

Fascinating insights into the history and culture of the region can be found in museums throughout the area. The Peppin Heritage Centre in Deniliquin was Deniliquin's first public school and has now been transformed into a regional museum dedicated to the Peppin family who in the 1800s developed a Merino sheep that could withstand and thrive in the harsh Australian conditions. In addition to its permanent exhibitions, the Centre hosts a variety of travelling exhibitions each year. Griffith's Italian Museum recognises the contribution of Italian migrants to the cultural enrichment of that area. The Berrigan RSL and Federation Museum has a collection of war memorabilia and photos on display. For details on opening times contact Marnie Steer 03 5885 2363

Development of the region was greatly assisted by the expansion of the railway network to link New South Wales and Victoria in 1884. Interesting examples of architecture can be found in the region.

The Jerilderie Railway Station was built in the Victorian style, whilst Tocumwal is Federation style.

The Finley Railway Station, of pioneer style architecture, is one of only two of its kind in Australia. The Finley Pioneer Railway Museum is now housed in this incredibly well preserved Railway Station. The Museum contains artefacts and real life railway stories. Guided tours are available seven days a week. Call 0418 669 600 to book a tour or to arrange station entry.

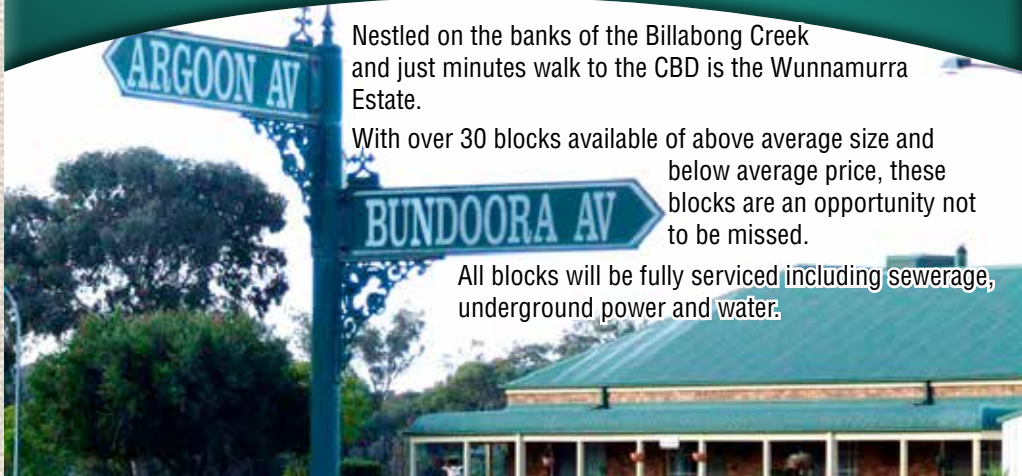

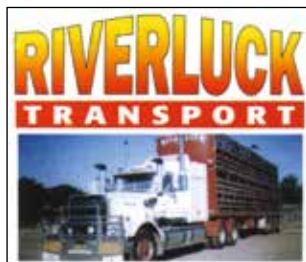
