Bulky Waste and Green Waste Collection

Clean out the shed and tidy up the yard! Let's get ready for summer and the bushfire season with our annual urban kerbside collection.

Coleambally: Monday 10 October 2022

Jerilderie: Monday 17 October 2022

Darlington Point: Monday 24 October 2022

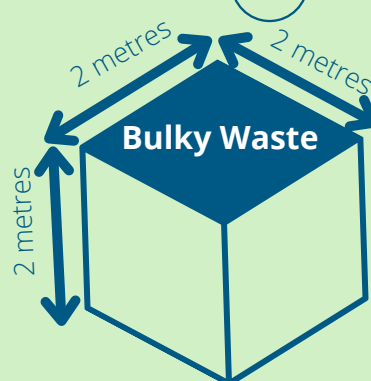
Do the right thing - Rules for collection

These rules are in place for everyone's benefit and to keep our streets safe and tidy. We are unable to collect materials if they don't meet requirements.

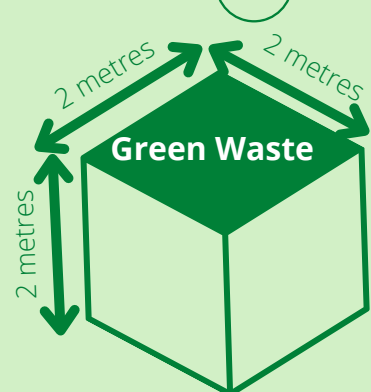
1. Sort your waste in **two piles**. Each pile must be no more than 2 cubic metres - this equals the amount that would fit in a standard (7x4 foot) box trailer. The bulky waste and green waste will be collected at different times in the same week.
2. Make sure individual items don't weigh more than 30 kg and can be handled by two people.
3. Tie loose items in a bundle or put in a sturdy box (no plastic bags).
4. Don't obstruct footpaths, roads or driveways.
5. Place your waste before **8 am on the Monday of your collection week** - no earlier than 1 week prior to that week.
6. Please remove items that are not collected. Items on the kerbside outside of the specified collection period are classed as illegal dumping and you could be fined.

We can accept

Bulky waste: Furniture and bookshelves, appliances, white goods with doors removed (excluding fridges), household goods/loose items, glass and mirrors (must be wrapped), mattresses, baby or child car seats, large plastic toys, swing sets, gym equipment, basketball goals, scrap metal, sawn timber off-cuts and large e-waste items, such as TV's, laptops, DVD players. (Scrap metals and e-waste items will be recycled.)

Green waste: garden cuttings/prunings and tree branches up to 75 mm in diameter and 1.5m in length (securely tied in bundles of up to 300 mm diameter), single tree limbs up to 200 mm in diameter (free of branches and/or leaves), tree roots that can be lifted by two people.

We can't accept

The following materials can't be collected. If placed out, it may mean your entire load is rejected. Items not collected must be removed from the kerb within 24 hours. Please don't bag your items.

Tyres, chemicals, hazardous household waste (oil*, gas bottles*, pesticides, herbicides, house/pool chemicals), fire extinguishers*, poisons, asbestos, pesticide, paint* and batteries*.

*Take these items to the CRCs at Coleambally and Jerilderie Waste Depots (see below). Coleambally and Jerilderie Men's Sheds also accept car batteries.



Did you know?

You can drop these items off for free all year round at the Community Recycling Centres (CRCs) at Jerilderie and Coleambally Waste Depots (Landfills) (20 kg limit):

- Household quantities of paint and oil
- Gas bottles
- Car and Household Batteries
- Smoke detectors
- Fluoro globes
- Fire extinguishers



Council offices have mini stations that accept household batteries, smoke detectors, fluoro globes, laser toner cartridges and mobile phones. Coleambally and Jerilderie Men's Shed accept car batteries.

All households with kerbside collection will move to a 3 bin system from 1 July 2023:

1. general waste, 2. recycling 3. Food Organics and Garden Organics (FOGO).
