Our three communities had the opportunity to be part of our annual ANZAC Day Commemorative Services. An invitation from Edify Energy to attend the Construction Celebration for the completion of the battery component of this solar project at Darlington Point was held on 4 May 2023. Both Sue Mitchell and I attended as representatives of Murrumbidgee Council.

The investment is huge, somewhere in the vicinity of \$230 million. To the lay person observing with keen interest but extremely limited technological understanding, it is hard to believe or comprehend the technicalities of the whole process, but impressive to say the least - interestingly the site for the battery storage did not flood in October - December 2022.

I was asked to receive the 2023 Debutantes at the Coleambally Catholic Ball on 6 May. This wonderful family night for the four debutantes, their partners and their families, speaks so very clearly to the value of small communities providing the village that nurtures and supports all of us from early childhood to our senior years. The Coleambally Parish do a great job facilitating this annual event. Congratulations to all concerned, and in particular the trainers Helen Kelly and Bill Morton.

On 9 May, Councillors and staff visited Wormtech at Carrathool - this waste receival business will be the site for our FOGO when our new waste strategy kicks in come 1 July 2023. It very clearly demonstrates the importance of sorting our waste properly.

Council, is busily engaged - both operationally and Elected Members in getting our budget to the table. I make note of the fact that Council helped facilitate workshops that occurred over the school holiday period, including skating and arts related activities - thank you to the organisers and those that helped run these activities on the days.

Friday 19 May saw the first of our seniors events for our Council area held in Jerilderie - the very popular theme for the day was Footy Fever. The event included morning tea and lunch.

Many activities had been organised, that saw much hilarity and great collaboration and funny outcomes - trivia, bingo, a handball competition, singing of club songs and a very interesting walk back in time by Ross Wells to his playing days at Wedderburn in Victoria.
